The Ville Rose constantly renews itself.

- From October 2019, the **Château de la Mounède** welcomes school children, walkers and cycling tourists by offering, among other things, culinary workshops led by Michelin star Chef Stéphane Tournié.
- In November 2019, the redevelopment works at the **Allées Jean-Jaurès** will be completed, allowing pedestrians to reclaim this area for themselves.
- In February 2020 the rehabilitation of the **Halles de la Cartoucherie** will be complete, creating a multi-use venue featuring a food hall, 4 cinema screens, a library, the BBB art centre, a dance school...
- **MEETT**, the exhibitions park and convention centre of Toulouse, opens in June 2020 in the north-west of the city, near to the airport.
- The Musée des Augustins reopens its doors in spring 2020, as does the Musée Paul-Dupuy.
- Works on the **Grand Saint-Sernin** project finish at the end of 2019, having included the restauration of the building's bell tower and the redevelopment of the square.
- In late 2019, renovation works at **Victor-Hugo Market** and its square come to an end, providing greater comfort for traders and shoppers alike.
- Toulouse has been a "City of Art and History" since 2019, a label attributed by the Department of Culture in order to showcase its heritage.

• DAY 1

Morning: visit the major monuments. Midday: lunch in the city centre. Afternoon: head to the Airbus assembly lines in search of the A380. Evening: dinner at leisure and overnight stay in a 4* hotel.

Morning: visit the great markets, tailormade tastings of Toulouse products. Midday: lunch at a restaurant situated above Victor-Hugo market.

Afternoon: panoramic tour, from the historic quarters to the banks of the River Garonne.

Late afternoon: visit and tastings aboard a barge devoted to the violet, the emblematic flower of Toulouse.


GREAT MONUMENTS OF TOULOUSE

After seeing the Place du Capitole, the basilica of Saint-Sernin and the Jacobins church, from the banks of the River Garonne you can admire the splendid views of the most iconic monuments of Toulouse.



A LITTLE TOUR IN THE COURTYARDS

A courtyard that is practically hidden, an unexpected courtyard, a courtyard that is no more, cloistered courtyards, a simple little courtyard... You may have already guessed that this is a trail through the city in search of its courtyards!



IN THE HEART OF THE SAINT-ÉTIENNE QUARTER

Visit the cathedral and its discreetly charming neighbourhood. This tour goes far from the bustle of city life and is studded with narrow streets, small squares and former official buildings that should not be overlooked.



AVE TOLOSA

The year is 50 B.C. All of Gaul is occupied by the Romans. And yes, that includes Tolosa! Across the city and at the Musée Saint-Raymond we can retrace the history of these ancient times together.



GRAFF TOUR

Street art has made itself at home on our walls. Discover its origins and its codes, the artists that have defined Toulouse from the 1990s and the artworks that are still visible on our streets, some created during festivals like Latino Graff or Rose Béton.



THE UNMISSABLE MONUMENTS

Toulouse is brimming with exceptional monuments. Here are some that should not be missed!



LE CAPITOLE

This is the emblematic building of the Ville Rose: set on the Place du Capitole since the $18^{\rm th}$ century, it houses both the town hall and the Théâtre du Capitole.




THE BASILICA OF SAINT-SERNIN

This 11th century basilica is no less than the largest well-preserved Romanesque building in the Western world and a stop-off along the Way of St. James that is listed as World Heritage by UNESCO.

THE MANSION HOUSES

During the Renaissance and enriched by the pastel trade, the city witnessed the building of a slew of sumptuous homes marked by the Classical style, including the Hôtel d'Assézat.

THE JACOBINS CONVENT

This gem of Southern Gothic art established in the 13th and 14th centuries boasts a unique vault in the form of a palm tree. The church houses the relics of St Thomas Aquinas.

SAINT-ÉTIENNE CATHEDRAL

Constructed between the 13th and 17th centuries, the originality of this cathedral is its architecture, a mix of southern and northern Gothic styles, and its rich furnishings.

SAINT-JOSEPH DE LA GRAVE CHAPEL

Built in the 18th century beside the Hospital of La Grave, it is nowadays an emblematic monument on the banks of the River Garonne, and the most shared snap on social media!

It is currently being restored and is due to reopen to the public at a later date.

LA HALLE DE LA MACHINE

François Delarozière and the La Machine Company have set up their stable of spectacular machines here in Toulouse.

More than just a museum, this is a living exhibition in which every machine tells its own story. In particular, the Halle is home to a truly monumental creature, the Minotaur, who gallops, handles objects and can take up to 50 visitors at a time on a dizzying ride.

Workshops, rides on the back of giant insects, lunch in the company of a gigantic spider... You could be dreaming!






Aeroscopia



Coach parking is located in the vicinity of public transport hubs to allow drivers to re-join their group in the city centre. Please refrain from using bus stops in the city and limit any disturbances by turning off your engine if your stop is likely to take more than just a few minutes.





Map of Toulouse city centre

Map of the wider urban area

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
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
