- It is too easy to simply depict the Nazis as being "pure evil". To do so would allow us to simply dismiss them as being a "German Problem", which is factually incorrect and creates exactly the sort of hatred that Hitler stood for.
- The disturbing fact is that Hitler's ideas were not new, not German, and have never gone away.
